Diploma of Membership of the Joint Dental Faculties (MJDF) – Examiner Specification

Role details

The Diploma of Membership of the Joint Dental Faculties (MJDF) is the new membership examination of the Faculty of Dental Surgery and Faculty of General Dental Practice (UK). It is a modern assessment designed to recognise the successful acquisition of the knowledge and skills defined in the new foundation training curriculum.

Examiners will be required to commit to a minimum of three days examining each year, and a further three days involving training and other meetings related to the MJDF. In-put to question setting will also be required outside of this time.

Each examiner will be asked initially to commit to a term of three years. Travel and subsistence costs will be paid. The examinations are currently held in London but may be extended to regional venues in the UK and overseas.

Requirements of the role:

Knowledge and experience

- Knowledge and understanding of the *Curriculum for UK Dental Foundation Training*.
- Knowledge of the rationale and standard expected of the MJDF and the knowledge and skills it should test
- Recent or current experience of postgraduate education and/or examination is desirable
- Be engaged or within the last two years active in dental clinical/academic practice
- Five years post qualification experience

Skills and abilities

- High professional standards as an examiner, including understanding of appropriate assessment techniques
- A commitment to the examination process

- A commitment to ongoing assessment, training and development as an examiner.
- Effective oral and written communication skills
- Evidence of a strong commitment to equality and diversity, and high levels of integrity and professional standards
- An understanding of administrative procedures and policies relating to the examination process
- Able to remain objective and dispassionate where necessary

Qualifications

- The examiner should hold the following:

Bachelor of Dental Surgery
Registration with the General Dental Council
Membership or fellowship of one of the dental faculties.

Applications Process

Suitably qualified applicants should apply using the application form which accompanies this information.

The deadline for applications is 17 October 2008.

Applicants will need to be available for examiner training to be held on Wednesday 26 November and to observe on Thursday 27 November. There is the possibility of observing on Monday 24 November if successful candidates are unable to attend on Thursday.

Notes:

1. Examiners are expected to attend the minimum number of 6 days per year as outlined above.
2. Full validation as an examiner will be dependent on successful completion of training.
3. Examiners are subject to peer review and review during the examination for quality assurance. The highest standards of professionalism and probity are required. Examiners who do not meet this minimum requirement may be asked to leave the examining panel.
