British Dental Receptionists' Association



The British Dental Receptionists' Association (BDRA) was formed on 19th January 2002. Previous to this, receptionists were the only

group within the dental profession not to have a representative body. The Association was formed to give receptionists a voice within the dental community and to provide guidance to members on pay, conditions and training requirements. The BDRA aims to clarify the developing role of the receptionist as the 'front of house' representative of dental businesses, with proficiency in skills from both the health care and the service sectors.

The aims of BDRA are to:

- Define the role of receptionist within the dental team
- Offer opportunities for the development of relevant skills
- Establish benchmark qualifications
- Represent the views of receptionists within the profession
- Provide a channel of communication and exchange of ideas among receptionists
- To provide pay guidelines.
